Tiger Token Treasure Store



On January 23rd at 9am the Tiger Token Treasure
store (located in the Mega Building, B521) will
open its doors for the first time.

The store will allow the individuals to exchange their Tiger Tokens
for items they choose. The store has various items including food
& drinks, arts & crafts, wall décor and much more.

Individuals can earn tokens for the following:

- pedestrian and bike safety - Example: wearing helmet,
stopping at stop signs, looking both ways before crossing
street, using sidewalks, crossing at corners.
- Attendance/participation/completing therapy at HAB.
Example: going to HAB for therapy and completing the
steps in therapy goals.
- Attendance/participating in Chapel. Example: leading
prayer, actively participating in the service.
- Having no peer-to-peer incidents or individual pivoting
challenging behaviors.

This is the start of the list, as we continue to move forward with
the store more areas to earn will be offered. Reminding the
individuals how they can earn their tokens is a great start. Tokens
are given at the discretion of the person issuing the Token. Each
reason to earn a Token is individualized to a department on
campus to issue.

The store hours will be (excluding holidays) Tuesdays 2-4pm &
Fridays 9-11am.

Celebrating 50 Years of Service!

Kalana Allen – Medical Records Director

We asked Kalana to share some of her history over the past 50 years and the changes she has seen.



What jobs have you had since starting your career here?

I have only worked in Medical Records. I started as a Medical Records Clerk then when the Director left, they hired me to head the department.

What are some of the biggest changes you have seen over your 50 Years of Service?

- Decrease in Population. When I started in 1975, we had well over 2000 Individuals living here.
- Opportunities the Individuals now have to work and go into the community. When I started here, we had our own school where FCT/D is and everyone went to school here on campus; now they go to school in the Abilene Independent Schools District like all other school age children.
- All the wonderful opportunities and activities provided for the Individuals who live here, i.e., dances, Prom, special events at all the holidays, especially Halloween and Christmas.
- Freedom our Individuals have to get out on campus and walk/ride their bikes, go to the Diner/Coffee Tea House and buy food.
- Number of staff we have caring for the Individuals. Staffing requirements are much higher now than back in the 70's and 80's.
- Believe it or not, in the 70's and 80's, we did major surgery on campus in our surgery suites in the Infirmary. We now only do dental surgery in those suites.
- In the 70's and 80's we had young children, ages 1 year old and up, and they lived at Pedi, which is now 6522 (the Infirmary). When we would come in the mornings, they would meet us in the hall in their little walkers and they would be laughing and smiling – it just started our day out perfectly. Some of them were just beautiful.

Tell us the Happiest Memory of your time here ...

The memories of all the incredible people I have had the privilege to work with. My staff who worked with me for 20 to 30 years. All the amazing Medical Directors, doctors, nurses, and administrators I have worked with. I have always said that working here is a calling and I have had the opportunity to work with the best of the best who truly loved and cared for the People who live(ed) here.

What you enjoy the most about your work?

Being able to, in some small way, assure that the Individuals who live here get the best medical care possible and that our providers get the information they need to care for the Individuals.

Do you have suggestions for others on how to achieve 50 Years?

Remember that "Money isn't everything". Always keep in mind why you are here; to many of our Individuals, we are their family and they depend on us to care for them and keep them safe. What we do is meaningful and changes their lives for the better.
